New regulation surrounding the Comprehensive Child Welfare Information System (CCWIS) has defined new standards for child welfare agencies and their data. We created this guide to the CCWIS data quality rules to help you prepare for the new regulation.

DATA QUALITY REQUIREMENTS



Agencies are responsible for ensuring that data is:

- Complete, timely, accurate, and consistent
- Compliant with confidentiality laws and requirements
- Validated to ensure that it supports child welfare policies, goals, and practices
- Not created by default

CCWIS AUTOMATION



Agencies have to support data quality with CCWIS automation that:

- Monitors data quality
- Provides data quality alerts
- Prompts child welfare contributing agencies for needed data
- Does not require duplicate data entry
- Reports data quality problems

REVIEW AND PLAN



The agency must review data quality annually and:

- Confirm that required data is collected
- Confirm that data meets quality standards
- Confirm that CCWIS supports data quality
- Confirm that data exchanges work and are standardized, if required
- Collect any review findings
- Develop and submit a data quality plan.
